What is St. Jude Math-A-Thon?

The St. Jude Math-A-Thon is a fun and educational way to teach students and educators how to make a difference for St. Jude kids. St. Jude Children's Research Hospital[®] provides materials for a week of learning for students from kindergarten to eighth grade.

Math participants also learn important lessons about helping others by raising awareness and support for children battling cancer and other life-threatening diseases at St. Jude.

St. Jude Math-A-Thon seeks to energize and encourage students to grow their empathy skills while testing their math knowledge. For more than 40 years, St. Jude Math-A-Thon and its participants have raised over \$500 million for St. Jude kids. Because the majority of funding comes from generous supporters like you, your family and friends, St. Jude has the freedom to focus on what matters most – saving kids regardless of their financial situation.

Meet St. Jude patient Yara

Yara was hospitalized with RSV and pneumonia in the fall of 2022 and could not get better, which led doctors to request more tests.

Yara, who was 3 years old at the time, was later referred to St. Jude. Tests revealed that the little girl had SAMD9/SAMD9L syndrome, a rare disease caused by gene mutations. The bone marrow in patients with the syndrome cannot make enough blood stem cells.

Sometimes, the condition gets better on its own. Other times, it can develop into leukemia.

At St. Jude, Yara has received blood transfusions. Since the disorder is hard to predict, doctors monitor Yara closely, said her mom, Brittany.

Brittany said living in Tennessee she had known of St. Jude prior to Yara's diagnosis and had supported fundraisers for the hospital, but she didn't know that St. Jude treated children with illnesses other than cancer. "You learn as a patient how amazing the research is," she said. "They say it takes a village to raise a child.

St. Jude is part of our village, and they are the healthcare part of our village. We can just make sure she is happy, and they make sure she's healthy."

Yara, the middle child of 5, will start kindergarten in 2024. She likes art and all things girly, including playing with her dolls, and getting her hair and nails done. She also enjoys traveling with her family. Her favorite destinations are anywhere with sand and water, her mom said.

GET STARTED ONLINE

(Six weeks before your event)

- Visit **stjude.org/math** to get started
- Click on "Find Your School" to find your school's fundraising website



SPREAD THE WORD

(Three weeks before your event)

- Promote your event by using your Math Mail Kit and Online Resources
- Encourage participating families to register to fundraise on the school's event web page
- Send home Sponsor Form and Parent Letter with participants
- Display promotional poster(s) in your hallways and classrooms to build excitement for your event

EDUCATE

(Event week)

- Distribute a Math Funbook to each student
- Complete one page of math problems each day
- Share the St. Jude mission with students to bring home the importance of helping others



DON'T FORGET

(End of event)

- Congratulate students as they reach their fundraising goals
- Share event pictures on social media and tag @stjude and use #stjudemathathon



WRAP UP

(No more than 10 days after event day)

- Encourage participants that collected check donations to use the mobile check deposit tool in their fundraising center
- Make sure to collect all donations to send to St. Jude, includes checks not submitted digitally. **Do not send cash.**
- Ensure all donation forms are completed and ready to return to St. Jude using the postage paid envelopes provided in your kit
- Once donations are received and processed, participants will be notified for prize selection via email
- Prizes will be shipped directly to participant's home
